



Like and don't like

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Like and don't like

Purpose: identify the use of like as a verb in simple sentences and short written texts. Social Practice of the language: Exchange compliments, likes and dislikes in an interview.

How to use the didactic material

 The ppt presentation was designed with the aim to allow the teacher explains students how to use like in a simple sentence.

Steps to follow:

- 1. First, teacher check what they know about the topic, teacher explains students what is like and how to use it as a verb in an affirmative, negative and interrogative way.
 - Teacher should use a Warm up or a total physical response activity to check previous knowledge.
 - Students answer the question: what do you like?
 - In plenary, students share their answers.



LIKE

You can use like to say that something is good for you or you enjoy it, To form an affirmative sentence we use: Subject + Verb + Object/Complement I like burgers For third singular person (He, She and It) we add an "S" at the end of the verb Subject + Verb + Object/Com. She likes burgers.



2.- During the explanation teacher asks students to write five sentences about things they like and five about what they don't like.


- Using the previous activity students create some yes/no questions in order to asks them to a classmate.
- Students share their answer and the rest of the group has to guess who is the answers' own.

3.- To assess what the students have already understood; the ppt provides a little game.





- The achievement to assess in this quiz' according with the key learning for comprehensive education 2017 is to revise likes and dislikes
- Teacher provides each student three papers with the letters A, B, C in each one.
- Teacher explains the game rules:
- students select a number and read the sentence or question and select the best option according with the slide, to share their answer they pick up the paper with the letter selected and show it.



• Students who have the correct answer obtain a signature.




4.- Teacher explains how to use like for activities, how to form gerund form

- Students write a sentence about what they like doing in their free time.
- In plenary students check it.



5.- To work with the achievement; <u>understand general sense and main ideas</u>, students read a text and play a similar game like activity 3.



- Students select a number; they write on their notebook the best option and share with the group their answers.
- Teacher may ask to a specific student to share his/ her answer or choose to work with the piece of papers in order to the whole group answer synchronic
